CESL1-CE 2028 ESL Listening and Speaking for Academic Purposes 8 (0 Credits)

In this course, you will focus on developing the speaking and listening skills necessary to participate in a university classroom setting or in other situations requiring formal or professional English language skills. You will work with a variety of materials to summarize, discuss, and analyze information presented. You will make presentations, which will receive peer feedback and instructor comments. By the end of the course, you will be able to offer opinions and to respond to the opinions of others. You also will learn to see both sides of an argument and to take a stand and support a position verbally. Finally, you will improve your stress and intonation; learn to interpret underlying messages; and gain the skills to organize, develop, and critique presentations.

CESL1-CE 2035 ESL Listening and Speaking Workshop 5 (0 Credits)

CESL1-CE 9007 American Culture, History, and Arts II (0 Credits)

The curriculum for American Culture, History, and Arts (ACHA) II</ em> is organized thematically, drawing upon New York City for English language learning content. The first week's theme—the geography and architecture of NYC— focuses on the development of the city as five boroughs and the importance of business and commerce. In the second week, students learn about the arts in New York, with visits to world-famous visual and performing arts venues. The program culminates with the final theme: history and culture of some of the city's famous landmarks, public spaces, and immigrant areas. This course is taught both in a formal classroom setting and outside of it. Throughout the program, classes and experiential learning activities, trips, tours, and excursions around New York City focus on varying topics related to the weekly themes. Participants gain language tools to navigate the city and to interact with real New Yorkers. The goal of the program is to give participants a rich and varied experience of New York City culture while improving their English language ability. Prior to arrival in New York, students complete an online placement test of their English language skills. This will be used to place students in level-appropriate classes and will be used by instructors to create course materials suited to the students' English language needs.

The complement to this course is ESL Listening and Speaking 4/CESL1-CE9024/ a>, which must be taken at the same time.

CESL1-CE 9015 ESL Reading and Writing 5 (0 Credits)

Students also study paragraph structure, development, organization, and essay structure, while working on multiple drafts to improve their ability to edit their own writing and organize ideas. CESL1-CE 9016 ESL Reading and Writing 6 (0 Credits)

This course, for intermediate-level students of English, focuses on reading and writing for both general and academic purposes. Students read from news articles, essays, short stories, and other sources chosen by the instructor. They study paragraph structure, development, organization, and essay structure, while working on multiple drafts to improve their ability to edit and organize their own writing. The complement to this course is ESL Listening and Speaking 6/CESL1-CE9026, which must be taken at the same time.

CESL1-CE 9017 ESL Reading and Writing 7 (0 Credits)

This class for advanced English students focuses on reading and writing in English for both general and academic purposes. Through analyzing news articles, essays, and other works of both fiction and nonfiction, students learn to interpret a text and to understand why authors make their choices of content, language, and structure. They also study editing strategies while writing multiple drafts of essays in different genres.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9018 ESL Reading and Writing 8 (0 Credits)

In this class for high-advanced English speakers, students focus on reading and writing for both general and academic purposes. They read from news articles, essays, and other works of both fiction and nonfiction to learn to interpret why a text describes a topic in a certain way and why certain evidence is used. They also study editing strategies while writing multiple drafts of essays in different genres. By the end of the course, students are able to interpret a text based on the author's choice of content, language, and structure. Additionally, they are able to write cause-and-effect and solution essays.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9019 ESL Reading and Writing 9 (0 Credits)

In this course, students with near-native fluency in English learn how to write well-organized essays that defend a point of view. To strengthen their writing, they read and analyze essays by well-known writers. They learn how to choose the right word, organize their ideas for an American audience, and add depth and power to their sentences. By reviewing ways to write concise, cohesive, and well-balanced sentences and paragraphs, they gain the skills to write in English more effectively.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9020 ESL Essentials Intro (0 Credits)

This integrated-skills course for students with little or no formal English training, focuses on listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Students learn the foundations of English grammar and work on pronunciation. They study basic vocabulary and expressions useful for communicating in English about everyday topics. The complement to this course is ESL Foundations Intro/CESL1-CE9010/ a>, which must be taken at the same time.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9021 ESL Essentials 1 (0 Credits)

This integrated-skills course for beginner-level students of English covers listening, speaking, reading, and writing in English. Students learn the fundamentals of English grammar and work on pronunciation. The course focuses on vocabulary and expressions essential for everyday use. The complement to this course is ESL Foundations 1/CESL1-CE9011, which must be taken at the same time.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9022 ESL Essentials 2 (0 Credits)

This integrated-skills course for high-beginner-level students of English covers English listening, speaking, reading, and writing. They learn the essentials of English grammar and work on pronunciation. They also expand their vocabulary and become more comfortable communicating about a range of personal and familiar topics in English. The complement to this course is ESL Foundations 2/CESL1-CE9012 which must be taken at the same time.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9023 ESL Listening and Speaking 3 (0 Credits)

This course for English students at the low-intermediate level helps you to continue to improve your English grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary and to better express your ideas verbally. Improve your English listening comprehension through guided practice using videos or online materials. Activities such as small-group discussions and role-playing provide a lot of opportunities to practice oral communication skills. Attention is also given to improving pronunciation. The complement to this course is ESL Reading and Writing 3/CESL1-CE9013, which must be taken at the same time.

CESL1-CE 9024 ESL Listening and Speaking 4 (0 Credits)

This course is for intermediate-level students of English. Learn how pronunciation factors such as rhythm are strongly linked to comprehension skills. Improve your listening comprehension through guided practice using videos or online materials. Also, continue to improve your grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary while learning to better express ideas verbally. Activities such as small-group discussions and role-playing provide myriad opportunities to practice oral communication skills. The complement to this course is ESL Reading and Writing 4/CESL1-CE9014/ a>, which must be taken at the same time.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9025 ESL Listening and Speaking 5 (0 Credits)

In this intermediate-level English course, students focus on listening and speaking for both general and academic purposes. They listen to authentic materials, such as news reports and presentations, and then they participate in structured and unstructured class discussions. They also learn to recognize and correct errors in their own speaking. By the end of the course, students are able to understand a description or explanation on a concrete topic. Additionally, they have the English skills to convey a description or explanation and to state an opinion providing specific reasons. The complement to this course is ESL Reading and Writing 5/CESL1-CE9015/<a>, which must be taken at the same time.

CESL1-CE 9026 ESL Listening and Speaking 6 (0 Credits)

In this high-intermediate English course, students focus on listening and speaking for both general and academic purposes. Students listen to authentic material such as news reports, lectures, interviews, and presentations and discuss them. They work in pairs or groups to prepare speeches and presentations that further explore the topics from the listening material. By the end of the course, students are able to paraphrase listening material, state an opinion providing concrete reasons, and provide a clear summary. Additionally, they are able to be active listening/speaking participants on topics of personal and general interest. The complement to this course is ESL Reading and Writing 6/CESL1-CE9016/a>, which must be taken at the same time.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9027 ESL Listening and Speaking 7 (0 Credits)

In this course, advanced-level English language students concentrate on developing the speaking and listening skills necessary to participate in situations requiring formal or professional English language skills. The course focuses on language fluency, pronunciation accuracy, and listening practice, as students take part in both formal and informal discussions. Additionally, students may give individual and group presentations of various lengths and participate in debates. By the end of the course, students are able to speak comfortably, express their opinions in an American classroom, and use strategies for reacting to a text aloud in English.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9028 ESL Listening and Speaking 8 (0 Credits)

This course for students with high-advanced-level English language ability focuses on developing the speaking and listening skills necessary to participate in situations requiring formal or professional English language skills. Students work with a variety of materials to summarize, discuss, and analyze information presented in English. They make presentations that receive peer feedback and instructor comments. Also, they learn to see both sides of an argument and to take a stand and support a position. Students improve their stress and intonation, and they learn to interpret underlying messages and to organize, develop, and critique presentations. By the end of the course, students are able in English to offer opinions and to respond to the opinions of others.

CESL1-CE 9029 ESL Listening and Speaking 9 (0 Credits)

In this course, students with near-native fluency in English learn how to give well-organized presentations that defend a point of view. To strengthen their English speaking and listening skills, they listen to and analyze presentations by well-known speakers. Also, they learn how to participate in high-level discussions on societal problems. Students become familiar with different registers of language and American culture. Attention is given to expressing complex ideas clearly and concisely to an American audience.

CESL1-CE 9030 Applied Skills Intro (0 Credits)

This course is for students with little or no formal English training. It is an integrated-skills course that includes listening, speaking, reading and writing. Students learn the foundations of English grammar and work on pronunciation. Students focus on basic vocabulary and expressions useful for communicating about everyday topics, including numbers, names of American money, colors, and common objects.

Grading: SPS Non-Credit Graded **Repeatable for additional credit:** Yes

CESL1-CE 9031 Applied Skills 1 (0 Credits)

This course is for students with little or no formal English training. It is an integrated-skills course that includes listening, speaking, reading, and writing. Learn the foundations of English grammar and work on pronunciation. The course focuses on basic vocabulary and expressions useful for communicating about everyday topics, including numbers, American money, colors, and common objects.

CESL1-CE 9041 Expanded Skills 1 (0 Credits)

CESL1-CE 9113 ESL Reading and Writing: Intermediate A (0 Credits)

This course for low-intermediate-level students of English teaches reading strategies such as looking for main ideas to help in comprehending a variety of texts. Students continue to improve their English grammar, sentence structure, and vocabulary while learning to better express their ideas through writing. Writing activities focus on paragraph development and organization.

CESL1-CE 9114 ESL Reading and Writing: Intermediate B (0 Credits)

CESL1-CE 9123 ESL Listening and Speaking: Intermediate A (0 Credits)

They hone their English listening comprehension through guided practice using videos and online materials. Activities such as small-group discussions and role-playing provide a lot of opportunities to practice oral communication skills. Attention also is given to improving pronunciation.

CESL1-CE 9124 ESL Listening and Speaking: Intermediate B (0 Credits)

CESL1-CE 9125 ESL Listening and Speaking: High-Intermediate A (0 Credits)

In this intermediate-level English course, students focus on listening and speaking for both general and academic purposes. CESL1-CE 9126 ESL Listening and Speaking: High-Intermediate B (0 Credits)

CESL1-CE 9127 ESL Listening and Speaking: Advanced A (0 Credits)

By the end of the course, students are able to speak comfortably, express their opinions in an American classroom, and use strategies for reacting to a text aloud in English.

In this Tuesday/Thursday morning class, you will focus on listening and speaking for academic purposes. You will listen to authentic material such as news reports and various types of presentations and discuss them. You will participate in structured and unstructured class discussions. By the end of the course, you will be able to understand a description or explanation on a concrete topic. Additionally, you will be able to convey a description or explanation and state an opinion providing specific reasons. Finally, you will begin to recognize and correct errors in your own speaking. (For nonnative speakers of English)

CESL1-CE 9156 ESL Skills for Academic Purposes 5/6 (0 Credits)

In this class, you will focus on grammatical accuracy in both writing and speaking. You will study complex grammatical structures which will allow you to engage in discussions on academic themes. You will receive extensive individualized feedback on your errors and learn methods for self-correcting. By the end of this course, you will have gained confidence in your mastery of grammar and will be able to write essays with improved accuracy. (For non-native speakers of English)

CESL1-CE 9160 ESL for Academic Purposes Level 6 (0 Credits)

In the Monday/Wednesday morning class, you will focus on reading and writing for academic purposes. You will study complex sentence structures and write detailed paragraphs. Also, you will study the essay forms for argumentation, narration, and description. By the end of the course, you will be able to paraphrase listening material, state an opinion providing concrete reasons, and provide a clear summary. Additionally, you will be an active listening/speaking participant on topics of personal and general interest. (For nonnative speakers of English)

CESL1-CE 9161 Program-Specific Academic English (9 Credits)

In addition to addressing the skills covered in ESL for Academic Purposes Level 6, this course is designed to provide specific support for you as a student enrolled part-time in degree program classes. Instructors work with topics and content that you will encounter in your degree program courses in order to target your specific language needs. Special attention is given to vocabulary, writing conventions, and discourse styles appropriate for the specific area of study.

CESL1-CE 9162 Reading/Writing Workshop Level VI for Liberal Studies (6.5 Credits)

In this Monday/Wednesday morning class, focus on reading and writing for academic purposes. Study complex sentence structures and write detailed paragraphs. Also, you will study the essay forms for argumentation, narration, and description. CESL1-CE 9166 ESL Topics for Academic Purposes 5/6 (0 Credits)

In this course, you will explore various assessment methods that can be applied in the classroom to assess language skills. You will also acquire contemporary approaches in the field of language pedagogy as an instructor of English to speakers of other languages, as well as review the fundamental principles governing linguistic grammar and lexis as pertains to language instruction. This TESOL directed study will examine the structure, vocabulary, and pragmatics of English for the development of effective pedagogical practices and practical classroom applications.
