If you're invited for an interview, you participate in multiple mini interviews (<https://med.nyu.edu/education/md-degree/md-admissions/multiple-mini-interview/>), in which you meet with several interviewers, rather than just one.

Our admissions committee embraces the broad definition of diversity endorsed by the Association of American Medical Colleges (AAMC) and uses a holistic approach to evaluate a wide range of student qualities and life experiences that are complementary to demonstrated academic excellence, strong interpersonal skills, and leadership potential.

The goal of holistic review is to gain a balanced view of all applicants' capabilities. We want to know how you might perform as a medical student and what you might contribute to medicine.

MD Admissions Requirements

At NYU Grossman School of Medicine, we're proud that our medical students are well-rounded and versed in topics beyond the humanities and sciences. We believe this diversity better positions them to solve healthcare's biggest challenges.

To be eligible, applicants must meet several criteria:

- be a U.S. citizen, permanent resident, or have Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) status
- have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in the United States or Canada
- we also accept applications from international students who have a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university in the United States or Canada
- the Medical College Admission Test (<https://students-residents.aamc.org/applying-medical-school/taking-mcat-exam/>)[®] (MCAT[®]), is required for all applicants

COVID-19 and the Admissions Process

NYU Grossman School of Medicine's Office of Admissions and Financial Aid recognizes that the decision of many undergraduate schools to adopt an online instruction model due to COVID-19 has significantly impacted the process of evaluating coursework. For the 2022 admissions cycle, we will continue to accept 2020 spring and summer courses graded on a pass/fail basis. The committee would strongly prefer letter grades for coursework starting in the fall of 2020. We will continue accepting online courses and labs for this period and moving forward. The latest MCAT scores candidates can submit are from the last administered test in September 2021. We realize there have been fewer shadowing, clinical, and research experiences, and our committee will take this into consideration. We continue to thoroughly and holistically review each and every application.
