Program Description

Our Executive MPA (EMPA) program is designed to merge your expertise with a targeted, practical education—advancing your career while empowering you to drive social change at a higher level.

Program graduates lead initiatives that enhance public service, shape policy, and drive organizational success. They excel in senior leadership roles across public, nonprofit, and private sectors, making decisions that have a lasting impact on communities. Here are some of the impactful roles that EMPA graduates step into as they advance their careers: Executive Director, Chief Operations Officer, Senior Director of Development, VP of Customer Experience, and VP for Program Strategy.

Program Highlights

- **Flexible and Customizable Curriculum.** Students work with their advisors to develop a customized curriculum that aligns with their personal and professional goals. Elective courses make up 60% of the program's credits, allowing students to focus on specific topics or skill sets. Students can complete the program in one year as full-time students, or take longer as needed if studying part-time.
- **Cohort-Based Program.** You'll move through the program alongside a group of peers, building strong professional relationships and a support network that lasts well beyond graduation. Additionally, the program hosts an exclusive LinkedIn group, providing valuable connections and resources to help you advance your career and expand your impact.

Admissions

Our streamlined application process allows you to highlight your professional experience and leadership potential. Applicants should have a demonstrated interest in management and leadership and at least seven years of full-time work experience, ideally with supervisory duties. We seek individuals who have a passion for leadership and a proven ability to inspire and drive meaningful change. Applicants must submit:

- **Two essays** to introduce yourself and to inform the admissions committee about your goals, background, and career plans as they relate to your intended academic pursuits.

- **Transcripts** from all colleges or universities attended in which you earned grades and/or academic credits at the post-secondary level, including undergraduate, transfer credits, continuing education, etc.
- **An up-to-date resume** that includes your education and employment history.
- **Two letters of recommendation**, from academic or professional sources.
- **An application fee** of \$85.
