Program Description

What is Art & Public Policy?

The Department of Art & Public Policy at NYU Tisch is an interdisciplinary department focusing on the relationship between art and politics. We offer an undergraduate minor taught by internationally recognized leaders in their fields. Our program is a meeting place for arts activists whose work cannot be contained by a single discipline or motivation. We rigorously explore the interplay between critical theory and creative practice.

Why should I minor in Art & Public Policy?
