## Program Description

The minor in Asian Film and Media offered by the Martin Scorsese Department of Cinema Studies in the Tisch School of the Arts is designed to provide an interdisciplinary and comparative focus on the historical and contemporary media forms of Asia, as well as in depth study of particular regions and topics. Students investigate the aesthetic forms of popular and art cinemas, the political economy of the film and media industry, audiences, mass culture, media activism, and experimental audiovisual arts in film, video, anime, television, radio, and digital media.
